Global context

- Surge in global conflicts
- Decline/failure of mediation and peace processes
- Breakdown of the international rules-based order



Accountability and justice mechanisms

- Insufficient victim-centered approaches
- Weak accountability and justice mechanisms
- Lack of political will and coherence

2. Characteristics



Civil society-led initiative	Consortium of 8 INGOs with FIDH as lead agency, the Secretariat of the CICC + 2 associate partners
Scope	International crimes, including gender-based crimes : genocide, crimes against humanity, war crimes, the crime of aggression, as well as torture and enforced disappearances, understood as “serious violations”. It concentrates on past, on-going violations, potential future serious violations and will focus on countries where the most serious violations are occurring.
Duration	1st December 2023 to 30 November 2027
FSTP lead	Civil Rights Defenders

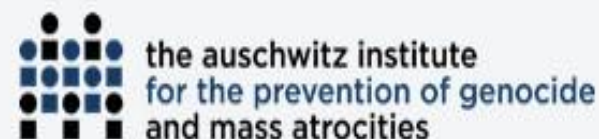

Two key objectives

OUTCOME 1: Increased participation, and agency of right- holders (victims, survivors, CSOs) in HRV formal and informal justice processes and to international accountability mechanisms.

OUTCOME 2: Enhanced effectiveness of duty-bearers' frameworks and systems to fight impunity and ensure gender-transformative justice and increased accountability with right- holders.
